Key to Your Protection on the Frontlines

You can't get COVID-19 once you've been vaccinated.







You still might be able to contract the virus if you've gotten a COVID-19 vaccine—but once vaccinated, you are much less likely to get severely sick or die from the virus.









ABOUT THE VACCINE

The COVID-19 vaccines are held to the highest safety standards.

BEFORE AUTHORIZATION

Clinical trial data is carefully reviewed by the Food and **Drug Administration (FDA).**



Before recommending use, the **Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices** reviews all safety data.





AFTER AUTHORIZATION

The FDA and Centers for **Disease Control (CDC)** monitor vaccine safety and side effects.







You can get the virus from the vaccine.







You can't get the virus from the vaccine.
The vaccine does not contain live virus.
It works with your body to build immunity to the virus.







Find out what group you fall into to determine when you can get vaccinated in the Commonwealth.

PHASE 1A

- Healthcare personnel
- Residents of long-term care facilities

PHASE 1B

- Frontline Essential Workers
- People Age 65+
- People Age 16-64 with an underlying medical condition
- People living in correctional facilities, homeless shelters, and migrant labor camps

PHASE 1C

Other Essential Workers





Getting a vaccine could make you test positive for the virus.







You won't test positive on viral tests for COVID-19 because you have gotten a COVID-19 vaccine.


Again, the vaccine builds your immunity to the virus—it doesn't give you the virus.









Download the **COVIDWISE** app to your phone—your privacy will be protected, and you can report to and receive key information from the health department

The COVID-19 Vaccine changes your DNA.







The COVID-19 vaccine does not change your DNA. What this mRNA vaccine does is help your body produce a protein that builds immunity to COVID-19.

 When you get a vaccination, keep the card given to you to track how many doses you need and to keep a record of your vaccination











- Some mild side effects, such as **chills**, **achiness and fever**, are to be expected for the first few days after you get a COVID-19 vaccine
- Report side effects directly to the Centers for Disease Control by downloading an app called V-safe to your phone









ABOUT THE VIRUS



- As of February 2021, COVID-19 has infected more than 107 million people worldwide and has killed more 2 million people worldwide.
- The virus is more contagious than the flu and is transferred into the air as droplets when people cough, sneeze or talk.
- Initial symptoms of the virus can include fatigue, fever, a dry cough, and in some cases, loss of taste and smell.




Are at Increased Risk

- At an increased risk for serious illness if they contract COVID-19 due to higher rates of underlying health conditions, such as diabetes, asthma, hypertension, and obesity compared to whites;
- More likely to be uninsured and to lack a usual source of care which is an impediment to accessing COVID-19 testing and treatment services;
- Often working in jobs that are not amenable to teleworking and use public transportation that puts them at risk for exposure to COVID-19. (Kaiser family foundation, 2020; health affairs, 2020)








Are at Increased Risk

- Work regularly onsite
- Work near fellow employees for extended periods of time
- Can't always physically distance at least six feet from coworkers
